Subject: Cabot Carbon Former Hogtown Creek Sump Area North of NW 29th Road

Mark and Wayne,

As we have previously discussed, I went back out to the area in April in an attempt to better locate the former sump area where pine tar was collected for removal in the Hogtown Creek floodplain. The area we found and previously sampled is located upstream of NW 29th Road off the west bank of Hogtown Creek in a low flat area. The area had some ponded water when I made a site visit in April, but we had a rainy March this year. When I have been at that area previously it was not inundated, but was muddy. The area is located near a sewer line crossing of the creek.

Attached is a map showing the location of the sewer lines overlain on topography (as a shaded gradation). The sewer line coverage used to generate the map may not have the lines located accurately, but in the field the sewer line is an easy way to locate the low area. It appears from the map that the sump area lies on parcels 08964-011-000 (Muncaster & Muncaster) and/or 08967-007-000 (Warren Reid) on NW 31st Place. The map shows the low area, based on topography and proximity to the sewer line on both parcels; in the field it appeared to me to be primarily on parcel 08967-007-000. This is something that can be better resolved with a future field visit. Also attached are two photographs of the area, one of the creek and sewer line and a second of the low, former sump area itself.
