Mr. Murray- Thank you for the City's followup on the signage along the easement west of Koppers, warning of contaminated soils. I apologize for delays in getting back to all of you due to my medical leave (still ongoing) and appreciate the recent correspondence and efforts that the City and DOH have made to get the signage in place.

Please note that DEP (Chapter 62-780 and the referenced 62-730) has specific requirements for posting such signs- including size, visibility etc, as previously discussed with City and County representatives. I will follow up with Beazer and with City and County shortly to ensure that the sign language, size and placement is consistent with DEP rules and the type of signage that has been posted at other hazardous waste sites.

Chapter 62-780 requires that the persons responsible for site rehabilitation (PRSR) post warning signs where there is a potential health risk. This is determined based on a comparison of contaminant concentrations to unrestricted use criteria for soils, sediments or surface water. Signage should be posted along the entire perimeter of the Koppers facility as well as the western easement boundary, west of Koppers. Noted in recent correspondence, it is important that gates and fencing be secured such that accessibility in the easement can be minimized. This will require coordination between the City and Beazer and should include maintaining locked access gates where they exist along the easement.

I am not in the office this week but will be in at least part of the time next week and will provide more details at that time requiring warning sign requirements.
