Good day, thank you for Beazer's comments on the GRU DNAPL Technical Memorandum. After consideration of the suggestion included in this Document, EPA approves of the proposed DNAPL pumping plan in concept on a trial basis. If this approach does not perform in a manner compatible to the DNAPL bailing (in terms of DNAPL volume recovered), then it will be necessary to follow up by bailing the well to remove any unrecovered DNAPL that might remain in the bottom of the well. This approach (pump first, then bail if necessary) should be done whenever the DNAPL recovery occurs, or until the contractor decides that the pumping of DNAPL is not a viable option.
